¹² for the equipping of the saints for the work of service, to the building up of the body of Christ;

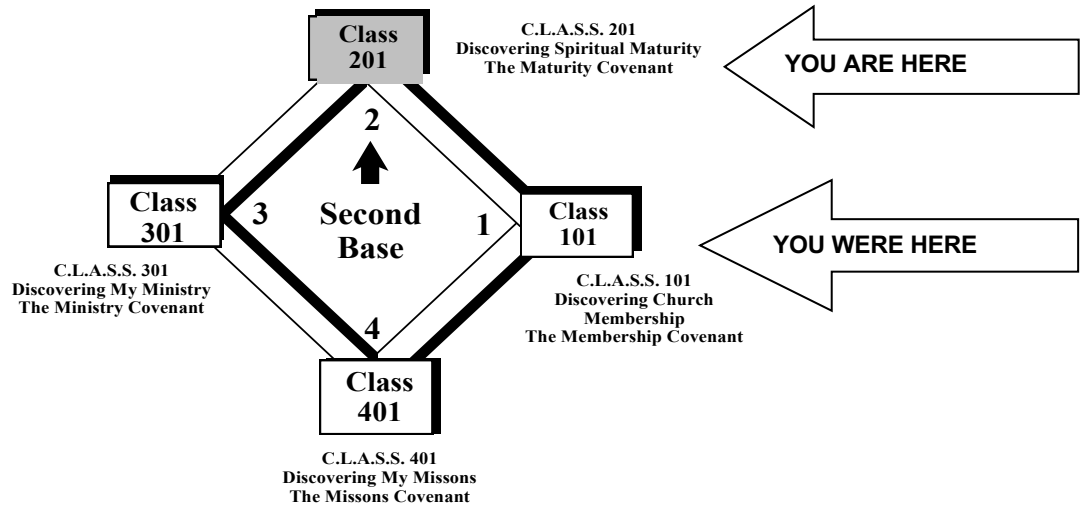

All Christians eventually ask the same questions: How can I get closer to God? How can I live more and more like Jesus? How can I grow in my faith? Where do I start? PATHWAY CLASS 201 is designed to answer these and many other questions.

During Pathway CLASS 201, you will learn four habits that will energize or renew your spiritual life. First, through Pathway CLASS 201, you will learn practical steps to making time with God a powerful part of every day. You will also receive helpful tips on overcoming the largest obstacles you'll face as you get started.

Second, every growing Christian needs to talk with God. This is called prayer. For some, talking to God is intimidating, but it doesn't have to be. In CLASS 201, you'll discover that God desires conversation with you and He's much more interested in you authentically talking with him than He is in critiquing your prayers. So, to get you started, you'll learn a pattern for prayer taken right out of the life of Jesus.

A third area that is covered is financial giving. Admittedly, this is a sensitive subject because few things give a more piercing look into our spiritual lives than how we choose to handle our financial resources. This section will help you take a healthy look at priorities and what really matters in life.

Finally, you'll clearly see the value of Christian relationships as we grow together.

As part of PATHWAY CLASS 201 you will learn how people at Vision Ministries Church have grown by becoming part of a spiritual family called a Small Group.

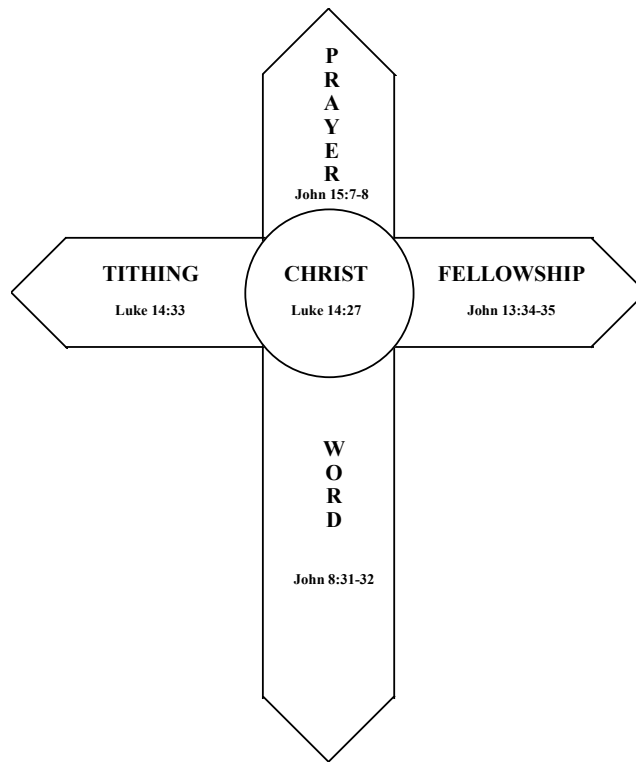

Developing a Consistent time in God’s Word

If we are to develop a consistent time in God’s word we must first understand, what the Word is and what it does in our lives.

The Bible is the Christian’s resource book, his manual for living, the light to his path, and the index for faith and practice. The Bible is God’s Word—His special revelation by which man is to cleanse and direct his way. As God’s revelation to man, it teaches man things he absolutely cannot learn about life and death apart from this very special revelation as Paul declares in 1 Corinthians 2:9-10, Psalm 119:9-11.

Because of what it is and does, the Bible is the most important book of the Christian’s life. Note the following sampling of verses:

Hebrews 4:12 (NASB95)

¹² For the word of God is living and active and sharper than any two-edged sword, and piercing as far as the division of soul and spirit, of both joints and marrow, and able to judge the thoughts and intentions of the heart.

2 Timothy 3:16 (NASB95)

¹⁶ All Scripture is inspired by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, for training in righteousness;

2 Timothy 3:17 (NASB95)

¹⁷ so that the man of God may be adequate, equipped for every good work.

HOW TO IMPROVE YOUR HEARING

1. Be ready and eager to hear God.

2. Deal with attitudes that prevent hearing God (Luke 8:4-15)

1. Pick a verse that speaks to you.
2. Say the reference before and after the verse.
3. Read the verse aloud many times. Record it!
4. Break the verse into natural phrases.
5. Emphasize key words when quoting the verse.
6. Write down the verse and erase a word one at a time.
7. Write out the verse on a flash card.
8. Carry some cards with you at all times for review.
9. Display your verses in prominent places.
10. Always memorize the verse word perfect.
11. Put the verse to music. Write a song!
12. Get a partner so you can check each other.

2. Pronounce it! Say the verse aloud, each time emphasizing a different word.
3. Paraphrase it! Rewrite the verse in your own words.
4. Personalize it! Replace the pronouns or people in the verse with your own name.

Pray it! Turn the verse into a prayer and say it back to God.

Probe it! Ask the following nine questions:

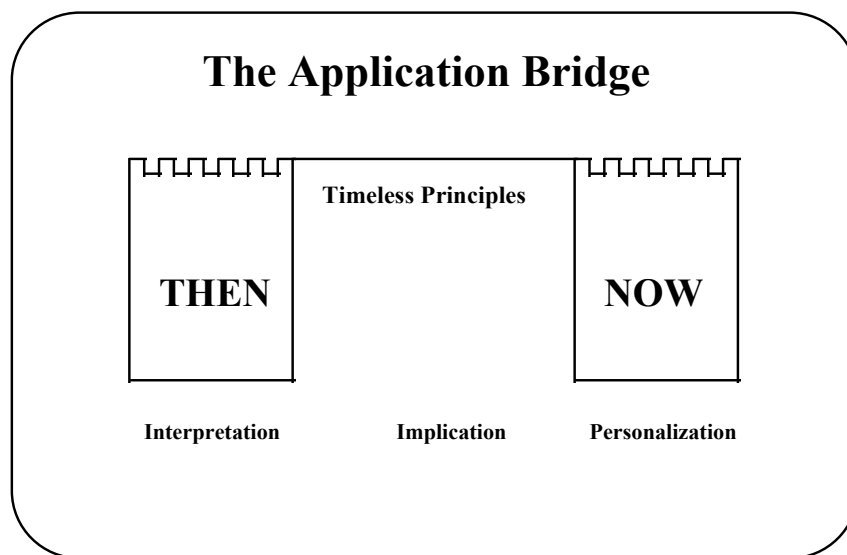

HOW TO BEGIN A DAILY QUIET TIME

1. SELECT A SPECIFIC TIME.

The best time to have a quiet time is when I am _____!

Reasons for considering a early morning quiet time:

- The example of Bible character. (Abraham, Jacob, Moses, Hannah, Job, Hezekiah, David, Daniel, Jesus.)
- It seems logical to begin the day with it.
- " The best time to tune your instrument is before you play the concert, not after!"
- It demonstrates that meeting with God is your first priority. You give him the first part of your day!
- You are likely to be more rested, your mind is less cluttered, and it's often the quietist time!

HOW LONG SHOULD A QUIET TIME BE:

3 Guidelines

Start with 15 minutes and let it grow.

Don't watch the clock!

Emphasize quality, not quantity!

HOW TO START AND MAINTAIN GOOD HABITS

STEP ONE: _____

You must start with a strong desire. You must be internally motivated. External motivations don't last. If you start only half-heartedly, you will never make it to the success point.

STEP TWO: _____

Begin right now! Don't wait. Don't procrastinate. You don't slide into a new habit. "One of these days" never arrives. You must have a starting point. It's easier to break a bad habit today than it will be tomorrow!

"If you wait for perfect conditions, you will never get anything done." Eccl. 11:4 (LB)

STEP THREE: _____

Announce your intentions publicly. Make a covenant or resolution. The power of a vow is awesome. It is particularly powerful if you put your commitment in writing.

"Make vows to the Lord your God and fulfill them." Ps. 76:11

STEP FOUR: _____

Never allow an exception until the new habit is securely rooted in your life. Each lapse will be fatal. A single slip unwinds many turns at first. Continuity and success at the start is essential. Never be swayed by "just this once". The act of yielding weakens the will and reinforces your lack of self-control. It takes 3 weeks to become comfortable with a new habit and it takes another 3 to 4 weeks (doing it daily) for it to become a part of your life.

IT TAKES _____ TO _____ REPETITIONS TO LEARN SOMETHING!

STEP FIVE: _____

Whenever you feel the slightest urge or prompting to practice this new habit - DO IT THEN! Don't wait. Seize every opportunity to reinforce your habit. Those feelings will not last, so whenever you feel inclined to perform your new habit, do so!

STEP SIX: _____

Get a partner who will support you and encourage you. Find someone who is willing to hold you accountable and check up on you especially in the early days before the habit is firmly rooted in your life.

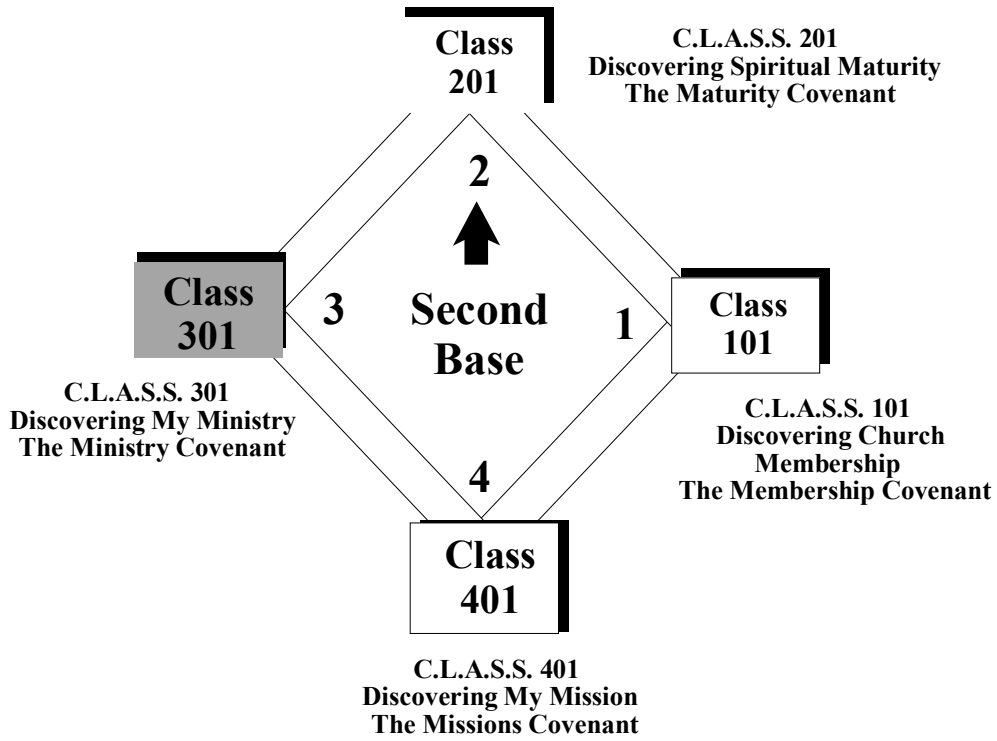
